Course Description

A chronological examination of art and architecture in relation to significant historical and cultural events from Pre-history to about 1300 C.E.

Objectives of the Course

Students who successfully complete the course will:

- 1. Develop visual arts vocabulary, as well as understanding of formal elements and ability to interpret architectural drawings in order to process the visual analysis of art and architecture and read related texts effectively.
- 2. Develop knowledge of the history and significance of art and architecture from Pre-history through the Later Middle Ages.
- 3. Learn the characteristics of major periods of art and architecture and understand their interpretation in light of pertinent socio-economic, political, religious and stylistic influences.
- 4. Practice skills that are necessary for the examination of art and the study of art history: observation, visual analysis, ability to compare and contrast, and critical thinking.

You will explore a section of Stephen Avenue Mall and visit the Glenbow museum to find art and architecture that has roots in Greek and Roman material that you have studied. There will be a drawing component, identification details and comparison with works in the Greek and Roman chapters of the text.
