# **Course Description**

A chronological examination of Western art in relation to significant historical and cultural events from WW II to the present.

Restricted to students in programs offered by the Department of Art

This course may not be repeated for credit.

## **Objectives of the Course**

Through this course the student will develop a general understanding of the major creative trends of the post World War II era, including Modernism, Pop Art, Minimalism, Conceptualism, Postmodernism, post-colonialism and Globalism. As well, the student will gain critical insight into contemporary art practices within the global art market.

The course introduces a vocabulary and a repertoire of conceptual tools suitable for the analysis and understanding of a wide range of cultural production. Through written responses and verbal dialogue

participants gain fluency with the various streams of thought and practice in recent and contemporary visual culture.
