Course Description

A critical analysis of the forms, objects, and practices that compose the art canon of northern North America. Organized thematically, this course covers the period of history ranging from European contact to the present day.

Objectives of the Course

Students who successfully complete this course will:

- 1. demonstrate understanding of the production, circulation, and exhibition of art and cultural objects in a consideration of Canada;
- 2. contextualize art and cultural objects as they relate to the social, political, economic, and cultural circumstances of Canada:
- 3. develop and defend evaluations of art and cultural objects of Canada using informed experiential and theoretical knowledge;
- 4. undertake critical evaluations of Canadian art and cultural objects in relation to the construction and maintenance of historically specific categories, such as gender, race, class, and nation;
- 5. articulate assessments of art and cultural objects produced in the territory of Canada in both written and verbal discussions:
- 6. understand the contingency of creating history and knowledge, and be open to critical self-reflection.

Textbooks and Readings

The majority of readings are in a textbook and course pack, both of which are required for the course and can be purchased at the University of Calgary Bookstore. The textbook is also available as an e-book through the library. Additional required readings are available online.
