Course description	A critical exploration of the development of and discussions about different art movements in relation to Modern Art and the avant-garde, addressing the historical circumstances that enabled the creation of selected art movements, which may include Impressionism, the Arts and Crafts Movement, Cubism, Surrealism, Pop Art, Fluxus, and Situationism.
Prerequisites and/or co-requisites	Credit for Art History 331 and any of 405, 407 or 415 will not be allowed.
Course Objectives	By the completion of this course, successful students will be able to: 1. develop a comprehensive personal perspective by responding to lecture material and by reflecting on works of art & architecture; 2. research and construct a focused, critical and analytical interpretation of a work of art or architecture pertaining to the course content and time-frame; 3. explain a primary text source [pertaining to the course content and time-frame] in relation to a movement, and the surrounding intellectual, social & political conditions and contexts.
