## **Course Description**

A chronological examination of European painting and sculpture of the Realist, Impressionist and Post-Impressionist periods.

## **Prerequisites**

Art History 201 and 203, or consent of the Department.

# **Objectives of the Course**

Art History 407 examines the major streams, influences and artists of the mid- to late nineteenth century. The main objectives of the lectures and assignments are to give the student a coherent picture of the course of European art in the 19c, and as it leads into early modern art. The course is also intended to refine critical analytical and writing skills in art and art history.
