Course Description	An introduction to the history, theory and philosophy of art education through participatory learning events
Course Objectives	Upon satisfactory completion of the course the student will demonstrate the ability to: - Articulate a basic philosophy for art education; - Identify/describe different theories and philosophies of art education; - Demonstrate informed, critical awareness of the ways that different philosophical and theoretical approaches to art education affect practice; - Express his/her understanding through writing, speaking and art making.
Course Activities	Activities include lecture/seminars led by the instructor, student-led seminars, class discussions, student presentations, films, slide presentations; studio experiences in art making; and may include guest lectures as well as field trips. As required, students will be expected to assume responsibility for their own transportation to and from any such field trips, as well as any admission costs that may apply. NOTE: The nature of the course requires interaction and co-operation. Class participation in discussions, presentations and field trips, and personal involvement in projects and activities will be taken into account when assigning grades.
Assessment	There is no final examination in this course. Marks are based on term work. Students will be required to complete ALL ASSIGNMENTS to pass this course. Due dates are final unless otherwise negotiated with the instructor. Late assignments may still receive a grade penalty of up to 5% per day of lateness. NO WORK WILL BE ACCEPTED, WITHOUT PRIOR ARRANGEMENT, AFTER THE LAST DAY OF CLASSES IN THE TERM (i.e. DECEMBER 3, 2006).
