Course Description

Two-dimensional activities and the structural, organizational, perceptual, social and psychological aspects of art.

Prerequisites &/or Co-requisites

None

Objectives of the Course

The course introduces essential visual design skills (including compositional principles, colour theory and application, conceptualization and ideation methods) and the practice of visual art research. At the completion of the course the student should possess a solid foundation in two-dimensional design and a familiarity with a wide range of creative methodologies. Lastly, through participating in class-time discussions the student will develop their ability to verbally discuss the fundamental aspects of an image.

Textbooks and Readings

There is no textbook for the course. The instructor may periodically assign brief readings for in-class discussion.

Assignments and Evaluation

The majority of the class work consists of in-studio exercises and assignments. Additional assignments will be completed outside of scheduled class time.

Art media can damage and stain garments so wearing appropriate or protective attire (such as aprons or lab coats) is strongly suggested when using the drawing studio.

Any drinking containers used should have tops or secure lids so they are not accidentally contaminated.

Supplies:

All brand names are *suggested* (instead of required) and were chosen because they are available from the University of Calgary's Bookstore. Other brands are available and suitable for this course. These supplies should be obtained by the second class.

Course Activities

The majority of the class time responsibility will consist of exercises and assignments that introduce and explore composition, colour theory and conceptualization. Some classes will be devoted to illustrated lectures that introduce the fullest range of drawing practices and the critical discussion of student assignments. As well, we might visit galleries and museums off campus. It is the student's responsibility to pay entrance fees (if applicable) and provide their own transportation to such events.
