Course Description

An introductory course in current photographic methods, including digital photography, digital image processing, film photography, film developing and printing and the presentation of photographs in both digital and paper-based media.

Antirequisite(s):

Not open to students with 300-level credit or above in photography. Credit for only one of Art 235 or 335 will be permitted.

Objectives of the Course

Upon satisfactory completion of the course, students will be familiar with the rudiments of digital photography and will have developed the technical skills necessary to produce quality photographic images through hands-on practices. In addition, the students will have some understanding of the expressive language and the visual culture of photography.

The emphasis will be placed on digital photography. Theory of black and white film photography, film processing and printing will be covered but not practiced throughout the course.

Textbooks and Readings

The required texts for this course will be on the course section of the D2L portal.

Assignments and Evaluation

Student assignments and projects will be marked on an on-going basis. The total of these assignments and projects will lead to a final grade. Assignments and projects will be evaluated based on students' success in meeting set project objectives and goals, as well as a demonstration of self-motivated independent research skills.

Additional Information

It is a course requirement for students to have a Digital SLR camera or advanced digital camera with full manual capabilities. Based on the personal project students choose to work on they might have to purchase a tripod. It is strongly recommended that students have a means to store their digital data on an external media drive such as a memory stick that has the capability to store a minimum of 2GB digital data.

Course Activities

Class 1 Friday, July 24:

Lecture: Introduction to the class syllabi and requirements. Introduction to the camera (the light-tight box), camera controls (Aperture, Shutter Speed, ISO), and futures (how to effectively use camera's internal light meter and white balance settings).

LAB: Putting theory in practice. Outdoors practice with class.

First Assignment: Understanding camera controls. Due date: 5 PM Sunday, July 26 on D2L.

Class 2 Monday, July 27:

Lecture: Review of selected images from the first assignment. Camera formats, camera lenses, the concept of image resolution, theory of black and white film photography, film processing and printing, the strengths and weaknesses of the digital imaging technology.

LAB: Second assignment: Depth of Field. Due date: 5 PM Tuesday, July 28 on D2L.

Class 3 Wednesday, July 29:

Lecture: Review of selected images from the second assignment. Composition in photography. Understanding light in photography: Natural and artificial light sources.

LAB: Third assignment: Composition in Photography. Due date: 5 PM Thursday, July 30 on D2L.

Class 4 Friday, July 31:

Lecture: Review of selected images from the third assignment. Digital workflow, digital image file formats, getting familiarized with computer and digital image literature, color theory and fundamentals of black and white photography.

LAB: Fourth assignment: Independent research on personal project through photography practice. Due date: 5 PM Tuesday, August 4 on D2L.

Monday, August 3: Alberta Heritage Day. University closed. No classes.

Class 5 Wednesday, August 5:

Lecture: Multiple-choice exam on photography theory. Presentation of selected photo projects from legendary photographers.

LAB: Fifth Assignment: Samples from on-going personal photo project. Due date: 5 PM Thursday, August 6 on D2L.

Class 6 Friday, August 7:

Lecture: Introduction to Adobe Photoshop.

LAB: Sixth Assignment: Samples from on-going personal photo project.

Class 7 Monday, August 10:

Lecture: Digital editing with Adobe Photoshop.

LAB: Seventh Assignment: Samples from on-going personal photo

Lecture: Digital editing with Adobe Photoshop continued.

LAB: Eighth Assignment: Samples from on-going personal photo

Lecture and Lab: Final Critique, review of all personal projects in class.
