Course Description

Theory and methods of creating meaningful art experiences for children aged 6 to 12, with a practical component.

Prerequisites &/or Co-requisites

Art 205, 231 and 233 or consent of the department.

Objectives of the Course

Upon satisfactory completion of this course, the student will be able to:

- Form a rationale for art in formal educational settings;
- Demonstrate an understanding of the role of art in children's learning;
- Demonstrate an expanded repertoire of skills and knowledge of art materials and concepts appropriate to children's learning;
- Demonstrate the ability to design practical teaching situations for young students based upon sound learning theory
