Course Description	We will discuss the basic ideas surrounding new media and related art forms. We will look at new media art as it has been practiced over the past decade, and look at the technology and tools of the subject now and for the next decade. Assignments are designed to reinforce the lecture material.
Course Objectives	To more fully understand the use of digital technology in 'new media', and distinguish between forms.
	To gain actual practice in creating new media works.
	To develop an appreciation for various forms of media art and for the effort and techniques involved.

Course Activities	Students will work on digital projects according to the class schedule. Assignments embody the 'activities', and there is something due nearly every week. A precise breakdown is not possible because students have a choice in which assignments they complete.
