Objectives of the Course

This course comprises an examination and exploration of recent historical and contemporary art/media practices through the notion of the "event" which employs action, performance, and media The course will investigate the critical framework and context ideas and practices leading to the creation and invention of new formats, environments, performances, network- based activities and installations.

The course will include lectures, presentations, research and the creation of a web-based media work.

Requirements:

- 1) Students are required to complete a mid-term take home exam (topics assigned).
- 2) Students will also be required to participate in group research on assigned topics.
- 3) Students will be required in groups to fabricate a web-based art piece.

Assignments and values:

- 1) a mid-term take home exam (topics assigned) (30%)
- 2) participation in research resulting in a group presentation (on assigned topics) (30%)
- 3) fabrication of a web-based art piece (in assigned groups) (30%)
- 4) In class test based on content from Student presentations (10%)

If this is not possible, you can use the drop box outside of AB 608. Assignments that are put into the drop box will be date- stamped and placed in the instructor's mailbox.
