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Course Description

Focuses on concepts, issues, and techniques of video as an art medium. Each student will gain experience and a working knowledge of concept development, video shooting and digital editing, in the context of contemporary art theory and practice.

Prerequisites &/or Co-requisites

One half course in Art or consent of the Department.

Objectives of the Course

Upon satisfactory completion of the course, students will be familiar with the historical and technical rudiments of Video Art and will have developed production skills necessary to produce quality video images. In addition, the student will have some understanding of the expressive potential of video as an artistic medium.

Textbooks and Readings

The required texts for this course are on the course section of the D2L portal.

Assignments and Evaluation

There is no final examination in this course. Marks are based on term work. Completion of all assignments and projects is a minimum requirement for a passing grade in this course. Final grades will be calculated as follows:

Evaluation Criteria:

All student work will be evaluated based on the following criteria: Conceptual Issues:

- 1. Contemporary relevance of concept
- 2. Originality of idea and approach to idea
- 3. Research process and exploration of ideas
- 4. Relationship between topic and medium (use of media and presentation)
- 5. Clarity of concept/ideas in relation to visual and auditory material

Technical Issues:

- 1. Sound levels and clarity
- 2. Image clarity and fluidity
- 3. Overall pacing
- 4. Presentation

Assignments and Grading distribution as follows:

- Project 1: Phone Camera Video Art (10%)
- Project 2: Speed (20%)
- Project 3: Conceptual split screen (30%)
- Project 4: Emotional Loops (40%)
