Course Description:

Perceptual and drawing skills pertaining to human anatomical relationships.

Prerequisites &/or Co-requisites:

Art 243 – Drawing II

Objectives of the Course:

The purpose of this course is to provide students with an increased confidence and comprehension in work that investigates the human form – its anatomical structure, as well as expressive and conceptual possibilities inherent in the subject.

This course will focus on the internal, structural anatomy and morphology of the human form as it pertains to artists. The skeletal and muscular systems will be examined in detail (groups, function, and effect on form). Over the semester, students will be introduced to both historical and contemporary representations of the human body, applying these concepts in project-based assignments. In addition, models will be used extensively to further develop observational and responsive interpretations from life.

Textbooks and Readings:

A required course pack is available for purchase at **Bound & Copied**.

Assignments and Evaluation:

Marks are based on term work. All drawings – including in-class model work and independent projects – will be assessed. All work will be submitted for mid-term and end-of-term portfolio review. Evaluation will be based upon qualitative and quantitative considerations of independent projects, inclass work, and class participation.

Portfolios will be collected directly by the instructor on the above-listed due dates. A list of all required works will be provided prior to these dates and all work must be submitted in the order requested. Students MUST submit work in a flat-fold portfolio with each drawing labeled with their name and assignment number. No loose or rolled drawing will be accepted for review.

There is NO scheduled final exam for this course.

Late Policy:

Completion of assignments and projects in a timely manner constitutes a minimum expectation. Any absence from studio involvement, assignments, or portfolios will be considered less than satisfactory for the course.

All independent projects will have a group critique and, as such, are due on the respective critique dates. Failure to present your work on these dates will result in a late penalty of 5% for each day after the critique date.

Final assessment and grading of these projects will be done in conjunction with all in-class drawings during the Mid-Term and End-of-Term Portfolio review. Any late or missing drawings will also incur a late penalty of 5% daily for each drawing submitted after the due date.

Failure to hand in portfolios on the above listed dates will result in 5% off of the overall mid-term or end-of-term grade for each day after the due date.

Course Activities:

Specific drawing problems and projects, in conjunction with slide presentations, lectures, and critiques will comprise the majority of the course activities. A minimum of six hours a week outside of class time will be necessary for exploration of materials and assignments.

Studio Procedures:

Students are expected to set up for work prior to class commencing so that lectures and demonstrations can proceed uninterrupted. These will NOT be repeated for latecomers.

As we will be working extensively with live models, it is also imperative that you arrive at class on time. Not only is a late arrival a disturbance to fellow students, but it is inconsiderate of our models' participation in our classes.

Attendance at all sessions is expected. Many students will be using the studio, so it is important to maintain care in setting up and cleaning of the space you use and to exhibit consideration toward workspace, materials, and other students.
