Course Description

A seminar and field experience course in which students take increased individual responsibility for implementation of educational strategies in diverse field settings.

Objectives of the Course

Upon satisfactory completion of this course students will be able to:

- 1. Present a thoughtful and critical analysis of a community venue within which art/cultural education occurs.
- 2. Develop a coherent and appropriate proposal for educational activity in a specific community venue (and, where appropriate, implement such a proposal).
- 3. Justify such a proposal with reference to current literature.

Textbooks and Readings

This is a "Blackboard" course. Class notes are available on the website. Students are required to access it frequently. Students will locate and share links to readings as required. Students will also be responsible for any costs associated with their field experience, including transportation, parking, etc.
