Thesis Statement and Annotated Bibliography	Students are required to submit a thesis statement and annotated bibliography of at least 10 articles and/or books of relevance to their proposed final topic. Annotations of each book or article should be about a paragraph in length. The purpose of this assignment is to encourage students to begin research early in the term and work towards articulating a clearly defined argument for their final essay. Presentation of Research Topic	Students are required to give an approximately 20-minute presentation of their developed research topic to the class. This presentation should include a clearly articulated thesis, detailed discussion of the main objects of analysis and an elaboration of the theoretical framework taken up in your final paper.
