## **Course Description**

Foundation course in two-dimensional art making. Creative exploration of pictorial space, composition and design will occur via learning fundamentals of perspective, colour, shape, balance and unity. Approaches may include wet and dry media, digital technologies, collage. These will be addressed in the context of research, problem solving, visual fluency and conceptual development.

## **Objectives of the Course**

Students who successfully complete this course will demonstrate:

- 1. An understanding of concepts and processes related to two-dimensional art making related to historical and contemporary practices.
- 2. Experimentation and increased confidence in a number of two-dimensional media including, but not limited to: drawing, collage, painting, digital media and photography, etc.
- 3. An understanding of principals related to two-dimensional design, the theories and the application of the principals, via participation and completion of all course assignments.
- 4. The capacity to develop unique two-dimensional works that have been developed through various creative approaches, techniques, and problem solving strategies.
- 5. The ability to communicate respectfully and collaborate with peers in a positive classroom environment that supports the sharing of ideas through discussions and critiques.

## **Assignments and Evaluation**

#### **Attendance**

Due to the nature of the course content, active participation, full attendance and punctuality are required for success in this class, particularly regarding the allotted lecture and lab components.

# **Participation**

Participation in the context of this course consists of engagement and completion of the in-class lab assignments, the sharing of critical and constructive comments during critiques and discussions, and the cultivation of a positive learning environment.

#### Sketchbook

The student's workbook for notes, in class assignments, and planning for larger finished projects. To be handed in at the midterm and the last day of class.

## **Project 1: Objects In Space**

Utilizing traditional drawing media and techniques, students will present a finished work for group critique.

Due date: Sept. 26/18, 9:00 AM. Percentage of final grade: 10%

## **Project 2: Fragmented Self**

Transferring traditional media into the digital and exploring various outputs, students will present a finished work for group critique.

Due date: Oct. 29/18, 9:00 AM. Percentage of final grade: 20%

## **Project 3: Piecing It All Together**

A combining of techniques and processes used throughout the course, students will present a finished work for group critique.

Due date: Dec. 5/18, 9:00 AM. Percentage of final grade: 10%

#### **Portfolio**

Accumulated portfolio of ten in-class assignment works and/or projects that best represent the student's term work.

Due date: Dec. 5/18

Percentage of final grade: 20%

\* It is the student's responsibility to ensure that all work is completed and submitted on time; doing so constitutes the minimum expectation of the course.

#### **Assessment**

The portfolio, projects, and sketchbook will be assessed based on technique, creative approach, and

problem-solving ability. Participation includes the ability to articulate ideas and make constructive comments during discussions and critiques. In addition, participation is assessed by the student's commitment to the course and ability to submit projects on time. Attendance is simply presence during the scheduled class time.

Students must receive a passing grade on the three projects and the final portfolio in order to pass the course as a whole.
