Course Description

Basic theory and practice of drawing, involving mainly still life and figure projects in monochromatic media.

Prerequisites &/or Co-requisites

None.

Objectives of the Course

Upon satisfactory completion of the course the student will have a working knowledge of conceptualization. Students will learn to abstract an idea in visual language and apply the idea through several stages in a cohesive concept, and in a context of the thematic work. Participation, feedback and exchange ideas in friendly environment of classroom and group—critique will be a large part in the collaboration and learning. While the class focuses on exploring various technical skills in drawing such as mark—making, texture, compositions and various drawing materials in still—life and figurative, there are three large assignments in the class which will explore various topics in a theme of consumerism.

Textbooks and Readings

There are two helpful texts relating to the thematic course, but students are not required to read.

- 1. Ways of Seeing by John Berger (easy read)
- 2. No Logo by Naomi Klein (easy read)

Assignments and Evaluation

Marks are based on:

- Progress made in comparison to starting point; bearing in mind previous knowledge and background of students.
- Participation in class discussions and critiques.
- Handling and care of studios and workshop.
- Organization and presentation of portfolio.

- Standard of work achieved in terms of originality, depth of investigation, research and completeness, in respect of both individual pieces and total body of work.

Participation 10%

Students are encouraged to seek input from their classmates and the instructor to improve their work, including technical skills in drawing. Students may choose to communicate in person, through email, etc.; the chosen form of communication is up to the individual student. Each month the student will receive a grade on their progress in the class work and participation measuring levels of strengths and improvements.

In class work 35%

(Use of classmates and instructor to improve his/her assignment and technical skill. The in-class work consists of all still life, portraiture and model exercises over twelve weeks in charcoal. Each month student will receive a grade on the progress in the in class work and participation to measure levels of strengths and improvements.)

In order to pass the course as a whole, students must complete all three assignments.

If students hand in their assignments late without medical reason, one grade is deducted per week.

Course Activities

Students are expected to come to class on time with prepared materials and tools for daily drawing exercises. There will be opportunities for students to discuss assignment ideas with the instructor.

Students are also encouraged to participate in the classroom and to make use of office hours to address his/her questions early in the course.

A weekly schedule will be handed out on the second class.

This course is designed as a low cost studio class. A list of material and assignment will be given to student on the second day of the class.

Program in the course including:

- -Two field trips (there will be field trips on the campus; students are expected to travel on their own to downtown art galleries and will be responsible for any associated costs) to "READ art" depending on the art program on the campus and in the community.
- -Two slide presentations from the instructor providing examples of thematic works.
- -Three group-critiques with tea and snack.
- -One mid- term review on progress with instructor.
