Course Description

Basic theory and practice of drawing, involving mainly still life and figure projects in monochromatic media.

Prerequisites &/or Co-requisites

None

Objectives of the Course

The course introduces basic drawing practice, visual recognition and responsiveness, and creative engagement. At the completion of the course the student should possess a solid foundation in drawing in a variety of media, a familiarity with a range of modes of representation and creative responses, and the ability to verbally discuss the fundamental aspects of an image.

Textbooks and Readings

There is no textbook for the course. The instructor may periodically assign brief readings for in-class discussion.

Assignments and Evaluation

The majority of the class work consists of in-studio exercises and assignments. Additional assignments will be completed outside of scheduled class time.

Grades will be determined by portfolio submission and in-class presentation.

Participation evaluation includes attendance at all scheduled lectures and labs, active engagement in critique discussions and effective use of class time.

Drawing media can damage and stain garments so wearing appropriate or protective attire (such as aprons or lab coats) is strongly suggested when using the drawing studio.

All brand names are *suggested* (instead of required) and were chosen because they are available from the University of Calgary's Bookstore. Other brands are available and suitable for this course. These supplies should be obtained by the second class.

Bamboo tapered brush(es) (M100-0)
Drawing nib set
Drawing board-masonite sheet—20 " x 30" approx.

Cartridge paper pad 18" x 24"

***Additional papers and materials may be required throughout the term.

Course Activities

The majority of the class time responsibility will consist of observational and responsive drawing exercises and assignments. Some classes will be devoted to illustrated lectures that introduce the fullest range of drawing practices and the critical discussion of student assignments. As well, we might visit galleries and museums off campus. It is the student's responsibility to provide their own transportation to such events.
