Course description:	An introduction to intaglio printmaking.  Basic concepts and techniques in copper etching.	
Prerequisites and/or co- requisites:	none	
Course Objectives:	<ol> <li>Upon satisfactory completion of the course, students in Art 379 will have a working knowledge of etching on the copper plate:         <ol> <li>Students learn to conceptualize an idea as a drawing and then an Intaglio print.</li> <li>Students will learn expand an idea through several printing stages as a series of images.</li> <li>Students will learn to operate an etching press manually and safely.</li> <li>Students will learn to process an etching in ferric chloride.</li> <li>Students will learn to print manually and obtain a consistent edition in a small production.</li> <li>Students will learn to collaborate with classmates to generate a series of images through Chine-Colle technique.</li> <li>Students will learn to read visual language as an Art Exhibition.</li> <li>Students will learn to verbally articulate an image and support classmates through group critique.</li> <li>Students will learn to write about visual exploration in the art projects.</li> </ol> </li> </ol>
