Course Description

Further study and work in sculpture.

Objectives of the Course

Students are encouraged to establish their own ideas in relation to prescribed problems so as to develop a basic understanding of three dimensional form issues. Projects will be assigned so as to allow the students to develop a basic understanding of contemporary art issues as well as to develop a basic understanding of the methodologies of sculpture. Concepts and techniques to be explored are modelling of the human figure, transformation of the figure, mold making and casting procedures, surface preparation and patinas, abstractions deduced from natural form, armature building, motion (kinetics) as a sculptural medium, light as a sculptural medium, sculpture as architectonic/architectural form. Media to be explored may include clay, plaster, plastics, concrete, wood, fibreboard, electronic systems, kinetic and light systems.

Textbooks and Readings

Readings will be assigned throughout the term based on handouts, websites, etc.

Assignments and Evaluation

Four major projects will be required from each student. Each project will be weighed equally to a total of **80%.**

It is expected that 2 projects will be completed for midterm assessment by the first scheduled class after Reading Week. The remaining projects will be due on the last scheduled day of class. All projects must be approved by the instructor before the student begins working on the project. Slide presentations and lectures begin each daily activity.

Each student will be required to make an oral presentation in class that will be part of the

participation grade. Evaluation will be on the basis of the quality (concept, material methodology and technique employed) of the projects completed during the term.

20% of the grade will be based on in-class involvement such as class critiques, oral presentations and gallery visits.

Note: It is the student's responsibility to keep a copy of each submitted assignment. Please hand in your assignments directly to your instructor. If this is not possible, you can use the drop box outside of AB 608. Assignments that are put into the drop box will be date-stamped
